Dear Lt. Govenor Denish,

On behalf of Musical Theatre Southwest, I would like to invite you to participate in one of our upcoming performances of the musical production 25TH ANNUAL PUTNAM COUNTY SPELLING BEE as a guest speller.

An unusual aspect of the show is that four real audience members are invited on stage to compete in the "spelling bee" alongside the six young characters. During its New York Broadway run the production had over 4000 volunteer spellers that also included invited celebrity guests. These celebrity guests included former Presidential candidate Al Sharpton, former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani, NBC Weatherman Al Roker, NBC Anchor Brian Williams, 2006 Scripps National Spelling Bee Champ Kelly Close, and Actress Julie Andrews, who missed "Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious". Our hope is to continue with this fun aspect by inviting local celebrity, political leaders, and media to participate in our local production.

The task is simple: "Ms. Peretti" calls the spellers to the stage at the beginning of the show, and they are given badges to wear. They are asked to request a definition of each word and its usage in a sentence, and to attempt to spell each word rather than giving up. During the performance, the actors sitting next to the audience participants periodically whisper hints about when to stand, sit, move in slow motion, freeze or hang on because the seating platform unit is about to spin. As the show proceeds, spellers are eliminated with successively more difficult words and serenaded on-stage as each eliminated finalist (both audience members and regular characters) is given a juice box and a hug. Each of our guest spellers will be given a comp ticket for themselves and a guest to attend their performance. You will be asked to arrive about 30 minutes prior to the performance so that rules can be reviewed and you can take your seats in the theatre.

Performances will be held at the African American Performing Arts Center on the ExpoNM grounds (San Pedro & Copper) in Albuquerque, NM. The following performances are available for your participation: Fri. March 19 (8pm), Sat. March 20 (8pm), Sun. March 21 (2pm), Fri. March 26 (8pm), Sat. March 27 (8pm), Sun. March 28 (2pm), Fri. April 2 (8pm), Sat. April 3 (2pm) and Sat. April 3 (8pm).
