HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS AND FINANCE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL 17

49TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - FIRST SPECIAL SESSION, 2009

AN ACT

RELATING TO GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS; MANDATING REDUCTIONS IN FISCAL YEAR 2010 APPROPRIATIONS; EMPOWERING CERTAIN STATE OFFICIALS TO REDUCE APPROPRIATIONS AND THEIR DISTRIBUTION RATES WITHIN STRICT GUIDELINES AND STANDARDS TO AVOID DEFICIT FINANCING; GRANTING ADDITIONAL TRANSFER POWERS; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. FINDING.--Due to discrepancies between anticipated revenues and actual revenues for fiscal year 2010, the legislature finds that New Mexico must reduce expenditures in fiscal year 2010.

Section 2. REDUCTION IN BUDGETS .--

A. In fiscal year 2010, if the projected balance of the appropriation account of the general fund is negative, the .179948.1

governor shall by executive order:

(1) reduce the recurring general fund appropriations contained in the General Appropriation Act of 2009 for each state agency under the direct control of any elected state official other than the governor by four percent, for an aggregate total of one million five hundred twenty-two thousand eight hundred dollars (\$1,522,800);

- (2) reduce the recurring general fund appropriations contained in the General Appropriation Act of 2009 for each state agency under the direct control of the governor by one hundred two million seven hundred sixty-three thousand four hundred dollars (\$102,763,400), except that:
- (a) the other financing uses category in the developmental disabilities support program of the department of health may be reduced only by two million dollars (\$2,000,000), which will be offset by two million dollars (\$2,000,000) from federal funds in the human services department;
- (b) the other category in the medical assistance program of the human services department may be reduced only by fourteen million dollars (\$14,000,000), which will be offset by twelve million dollars (\$12,000,000) from federal funds; and
- (c) the public defender department shall not be reduced by a percent greater than the average percent .179948.1

reduction for district attorneys;

appropriations contained in the General Appropriation Act of 2009 for each public post-secondary educational institution by four percent in the instruction and general purposes category and six and five-tenths percent in every other category, including research and public service projects, with the institution determining reductions in each item of the category;

- appropriations contained in the General Appropriation Act of 2009 for the New Mexico military institute, the New Mexico school for the blind and visually impaired and the New Mexico school for the deaf by four percent in the instruction and general purposes category and six and five-tenths percent in every other category, including research and public service projects, with the school determining reductions in each item of the category; and
- (5) reduce the recurring general fund appropriation contained in the General Appropriation Act of 2009 for public school support as follows:
- (a) the state equalization guarantee distribution by two percent; and
- (b) the transportation distribution, including operational, school-owned bus replacements and rental .179948.1

fees; the supplemental distribution, including out-of-state tuition and emergency supplemental; the instructional material fund; dual-credit instructional materials; the Indian education fund; the educational technology fund; the schools in need of improvement fund; and public education department special appropriations by six and five-tenths percent.

- B. In making reductions, the governor shall make reductions in the recurring general fund appropriations of state agencies contained in the General Appropriation Act of 2009 in such a way that the reduction will not prevent a state agency from performing its statutory responsibilities and will not place it in violation of a binding contract.
- C. In making reductions pursuant to Paragraph (2) of Subsection A of this section, the governor is encouraged to first reduce personal services and employee benefits for sixty vacant exempt positions.
 - Section 3. REDUCTION IN CERTAIN JUDICIAL BUDGETS .--
- A. In fiscal year 2010, if the projected balance of the appropriation account of the general fund is negative, the governor shall notify the chief justice of the New Mexico supreme court, who shall then exercise the same powers of reduction of general fund appropriations over the judicial branch of government as have been given to the governor in Subsection A of Section 2 of this act, and the reductions shall be as follows:

- (1) the aggregate reduction of five million nine hundred seventy-five thousand six hundred dollars (\$5,975,600) for the supreme court law library, the New Mexico compilation commission, the judicial standards commission, the court of appeals, the supreme court, the administrative office of the courts, the supreme court building commission, all judicial district courts and the Bernalillo county metropolitan court; and
- (2) the aggregate reduction of two million four hundred thirty-six thousand one hundred dollars (\$2,436,100) for district attorneys and the administrative office of the district attorneys.
- B. In making reductions, the chief justice shall make reductions in the recurring general fund appropriations of judicial agencies and district attorneys contained in the General Appropriation Act of 2009 in such a way that the reduction will not prevent a judicial agency or district attorney from performing its statutory responsibilities and will not place it in violation of a binding contract.

Section 4. REDUCTION IN CERTAIN LEGISLATIVE BUDGETS.--In fiscal year 2010, if the projected balance of the appropriation account of the general fund is negative, the governor shall notify the New Mexico legislative council, which shall then reduce legislative building services by one hundred sixty-four thousand two hundred dollars (\$164,200).

Section 5. ADDITIONAL REDUCTIONS FOR EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND PUBLIC SCHOOLS--AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT APPROPRIATIONS.--

- A. In addition to the general fund reductions in Paragraph (3) of Subsection A of Section 2 of this act for instruction and general purposes, the instruction and general purposes category at each public post-secondary educational institution shall be further reduced proportionally by thirteen million four hundred thousand dollars (\$13,400,000).
- B. In addition to the general fund reductions in Subparagraph (a) of Paragraph (5) of Subsection A of Section 2 of this act, the state equalization guarantee distribution shall be further reduced by forty-five million five hundred thousand dollars (\$45,500,000).
- C. For fiscal year 2010, of the ninety-three million two hundred thousand dollars (\$93,200,000) remaining from the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 allocation to the state through the education fund of the state fiscal stabilization fund, forty-five million five hundred thousand dollars (\$45,500,000) shall be distributed to school districts and charter schools through the state equalization guarantee distribution, and thirteen million four hundred thousand dollars (\$13,400,000) shall be distributed proportionally to public post-secondary educational institutions in the instruction and general purposes category. .179948.1

D. Of the amount remaining from the public safety and other government services allocation from the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) is allocated to the appropriation account of the general fund for fiscal year 2010.

Section 6. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION--SECTION 5.--The appropriation in Section 5 of the General Appropriation Act of 2009 to the department of information technology for the New Mexico computing applications center is reduced by one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000).

Section 7. TOBACCO SETTLEMENT PROGRAM FUND--APPROPRIATION TO MEDICAID.--Four million dollars (\$4,000,000) is appropriated from the tobacco settlement program fund to the human services department for expenditure in fiscal year 2010 for the medical assistance program. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2010 shall revert to the tobacco settlement program fund.

Section 8. PUBLIC SCHOOLS--EMERGENCY SUPPLEMENTAL.--Three million dollars (\$3,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the emergency supplemental distribution of the public school fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2010 by the public education department to make emergency distributions to small school districts and state-chartered charter schools in financial need, but no money shall be distributed to any school district or state-chartered charter school having cash and .179948.1

invested reserves, or other resources or any combination thereof, equaling five percent or more of the school district's or state-chartered charter school's operational budget. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2010 shall revert to the general fund.

Section 9. WORKFORCE SOLUTIONS DEPARTMENT

APPROPRIATION.--Two million dollars (\$2,000,000) is

appropriated from the federal American Recovery and

Reinvestment Act of 2009 unemployment insurance modernization

funding to the workforce solutions department for operating

expenditures in fiscal year 2010.

Section 10. OPERATING BUDGETS AND ALLOTMENTS REDUCED TO COMPLY--OTHER REDUCTIONS TO CONFORM--OVER-ALLOTMENTS-DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.--

A. The department of finance and administration shall reduce fiscal year 2010 operating budgets and adjust allotments to comply with the provisions of this act and may reduce appropriations from other state funds, internal service/interagency transfers and federal funds as necessary to match the general fund reductions in the fiscal year 2010 operating budgets. The legislative finance committee shall review the adjusted operating budgets in a timely manner.

B. If, in this act or any other act of the first special session of the forty-ninth legislature, a general fund appropriation or budget is reduced and funds in excess of the .179948.1

amount of the reduced appropriation or budget have already been allotted to the state agency receiving the appropriation, the department of finance and administration may reduce any other general fund allotment to the state agency in order to recoup the over-allotment of the reduced appropriation or budget. the case of an appropriation made to one state agency but disbursed or transferred to another state agency, the department of finance and administration may reduce any other general fund allotment to the agency to which the appropriation was disbursed or transferred in order to recoup the overallotment of the reduced appropriation or budget. authority provided in this section is additional to any other power the department of finance and administration has to remedy over-allotments, and the grant of authority in this section shall not be deemed to be a legislative determination that the department of finance and administration does not otherwise have the authority provided in this section.

C. As used in this section, "state agency" means any department, institution, board, bureau, commission, district or committee of the government of the state and means every office or officer of any of the above.

Section 11. FISCAL YEAR 2011 BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS.--The recurring general fund reductions provided for in this act shall be carried forward in the fiscal year 2011 executive budget recommendations presented to the legislature as provided .179948.1
