



Eleanor Chavez voted to **PROTECT** violent criminals

In 2003, Katie Sepich, a college student, was brutally raped and murdered. Investigators found the DNA of the murderer on her body, but the crime remained unsolved until the killer was arrested for another crime and his DNA was matched to Katie's murder.

Katie's parents bravely fought for Katie's Law, which first required violent felons to give their DNA to a database. If a criminal's DNA matches an unsolved crime, Katie's Law brings them to justice.

Chavez voted Against Katie's Law

Eleanor Chavez voted against Katie's Law -- a law that requires criminals arrested for felonies to submit DNA samples.¹ It is a common-sense law that solves rapes and murder cases and was championed by Democrats. **It passed by a 61-6 vote, but Eleanor Chavez was one of six legislators who voted to protect violent criminals.** Chavez sided with violent criminals over New Mexico families and made our neighborhoods less safe.
