Dear Javier Gonzales,

As per our conversation on March 27, 2010, I explained Vote Builder access had been denied to our campaign staff by the Democratic Party of New Mexico (DPNM). We were told by Scott Forrester, Executive Director of DPNM, that an “anti incumbent” policy was the reason for denial. We did request a copy of such policy and did not receive a response. We had been assured by Richard Ellenberg, Democratic Chair for Santa Fe County, that access could be purchased at state headquarters.

During our conversation, you made it extremely clear that the DPNM had consciously made the decision to deny my campaign access. Since this time, we have learned the DPNM has made Vote Builder available to challengers of incumbents in previous legislative elections. Therefore precedent exists, and we are asking that the party comply with its previous past practices and allow us access to Vote Builder. We understand this is an important tool in running an effective campaign. Please reconsider your stance.
