Dear Committee Members,

My name is Frank Chiapetti, and I would like to share with you who I am and how education has factored into my life. My parents stressed education with me which I am passing on to my children. I am the first generation to graduate with a post-high school degree and with this fundamental belief in the importance of education I am proud to have my oldest daughter earn her Bachelor Degrees in Zoology and Psychology.

I graduated from New Mexico State University in 1989, with a Bachelor in Business Administration, majoring in management and finance. Although I have always enjoyed math, especially statistical data, which was my primary influence going into business, my passion was and always has been working with our youth. After working several years in business, I found myself drawn to the educational field of teaching, which prompted me to teach Special Education in the Gallup McKinley County School System. In 1993, I wanted to be grounded in my new chosen profession and pursued a Master of Arts in Teaching Special Education. I have been especially fortunate to have taught at all three levels of academic discipline: elementary, junior high school, and high school.

In 1999, I received a coordinator position with the district, which led me to pursue a Masters in Educational Leadership. As a coordinator, I was able to attain new skills and acquire many new traits necessary to succeed as a central office administrator. I gained experience in Federal and operational budgets, State funding, and full-time equivalent (FTE) derived from student counts. My experience also includes Special Education law and due process hearings, as well as developing mediation skills. The most valuable experience I took away from this position was working with every school in the county, being able to see the many different schools, the diversity of cultures, and the unique needs of each school.

When I began my principal-ship at Gallup Junior High School (GJHS), I took over an administration that had embezzled from student accounts, and had let the academic and learning environment reach levels that were far from being acceptable. With a strong community and dedicated teachers, we were able to change the learning environment of that former school ... to what you see today at Miyamura High School. With an emphasis on academics and encouragement for each student to participate in activities, our school climate has blossomed to a high school that is consistently raising the average test scores, and where learning and graduating has become a priority with many of our students. In my last two years, our first two graduating classes had earned the following esteemed academic achievements: GATE and National Merit Scholarships, BA/MD Program Recipients at UNM, and appointments to the US Naval and US Air Force Academies.

As a principal; I learned, acquired, and attained many new skills; but the one opportunity I am thankful for the most, is the one most principals do not ever experience. I was very fortunate to have been involved in the making of Miyamura High School, from its very beginnings: the first presentation to the Public School Outlay Committee for planning Miyamura High School, developing the long-term, five-year plan for the district, to the design and architecture, and the final construction phase of Miyamura High School. The

transformation years of converting to a full high school gave me insight into how state and federal funding drive our school systems.

Working with the architectural firms and the Public School Finance Outlay members was a learning experience, but it was the openness of working with the community of Gallup, and the surrounding area, that was most important to me. Speaking at area Chapter Houses, developing the survey to name the school (Miyamura High School) and its mascot established my leadership philosophy. This philosophy is to always involve stakeholders in my decision making, and while making decisions, it is vital that I be open, transparent, and honest. Along with the many decisions to be made, accountability should always be factored into how it will affect our students first. We can never lose sight of why we are here.

I have carried this philosophy into my current role as Superintendent. I have used the turn-around skills learned in my business degree, from the University of Virginia Partnership for Leaders in Education, and from the NMPED Principals Pursuing Excellence Program to serve as a catalyst for improving the education in McKinley County. The district has shown tremendous growth over the last three years with 80% of our schools raising the points on the PED report card. The district grade has been brought from an "F" to a "C".

By basing decisions on student need, I have been able to make several tough decisions that were needed but were not always popular. To get through these difficult changes, communication and involving all stakeholders have been important. While these decisions were not popular, taking the time to explain how they affect students, the majority of people have accepted the changes. These decisions are helping all students including our large population of ELL students, economically disadvantaged students (district now qualifies for 100% free lunches), and special needs students. These decisions along with strong talent management, strategies to focus on every individual child, and systems to address each of their needs is at the forefront of our changes.

My passion for children is shown in my involvement in the community. Before becoming superintendent I have officiated volleyball, basketball, baseball and softball for the NMAA to be involved with students. Taking time out to be active with students in their activities including band, drama, 4H, and other clubs is not only a way to get to know students and their families, it is also a way of giving back to the community. I was also blessed to grow up in a cultural diverse community where I am able to participate in many cultural activities. The Hispanic, Zuni, Navajo, Arabic, and European cultures all have made an impact on my life and have created many friendships and working relationships that will last forever.
